

The Annual General Meeting of the B.U.S.C.R. 1960

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 10th May 1960 in the men's lounge.

The minutes of the last A.G.M. were read, approved and then signed by the Chairman Roderick Pipe. There were no matters arising.

Chairmans and Ringing Master's Report

Rod. Pipe said that the ringing of the Society had improved during the year but it must try to improve its striking. On the whole striking was reasonable but occasionally marred by individual members. During the year there had been a most successful tour in Somerset, Easter 1959, and practices had been held at regular intervals during the session. Several quarter peals had been rung together with 1 peal. No quarter peal or peal attempts had been lost. He concluded by thanking the members for their co-operation during his time of office.

Secretary's Report

Alan Collings said that the year had been successful considering that the Society had to be completely reorganised and a new constitution drawn up at the beginning of the Autumn term.
